CONGREGATIONAL ASSESSMENT WORKSHEET

This congregational self-assessment tool is designed to help you select an appropriate **Welcoming Community Network (WCN)** curriculum from the cautious and measured to the adventuresome. These questions are not to be seen as sure-fire predictors, but they may serve as helpful guides to a congregation's overall temperament when considering controversial subjects.

Scoring is from 1 to a possible 5 points and is question specific. Each person participating in the assessment process should have a separate Worksheet. Each person should total the score on the Worksheet. See further scoring instructions at the end of this Worksheet.

There is no perfect template for how to do WCN "right" in a congregation. Each congregational team is encouraged to adapt or develop its own curriculum. Building the most suitable process for your situation takes careful attention. Remember, as always, the building of solid relationships *across* ideological lines, and real engagement in the process by a significant percentage of active congregants, are the best predictors of probable success.

Be critical and honest when you complete this Congregational Assessment tool. It will not help you or your congregation to characterize the congregation differently than it really is.

Note: Any question which does not seem applicable should be scored with a "3."
